5. Rulemaking – OAC 252:4 Rules of Practice and Procedure

The DEQ is proposing to amend Chapter 4, Subchapter 17 (Electronic Reporting) and to revoke Appendix E (Electronic signature agreement) to allow for electronic verification of the reporting entity's identity rather than requiring a notarized paper submittal for the identification process.

6. Rulemaking – OAC 252:100 Air Pollution Control

The DEQ is proposing to make revisions to Chapter 100 as follows: (1) to revoke the existing Appendix Q, Incorporation by Reference, and adopt an updated Appendix Q to incorporate EPA's latest regulatory changes including Table 1 found in 40 CFR Part 51, Subpart A, Appendix A. The DEQ is also proposing to update language in Subchapter 2, Incorporation by Reference, to reflect the latest date of incorporation of EPA regulations in Appendix Q; (2) to amend Subchapter 5 (Registration, Emission Inventory and Annual Operating Fees), for consistency with EPA's Air Emission Reporting Requirements contained in 40 CFR Part 51, Subpart A; (3) to amend Subchapter 7 (Permits for Minor Facilities) to simplify the permitting process for facilities whose only obligation to obtain a permit is due to the presence of an emergency engine that is subject to a federal standard and to clarify which air quality control rules apply to de minimis and permit-exempt facilities; and (4) to amend Subchapter 9 (Excess Emission Reporting Requirements During Periods of Startup, Shutdown and Malfunction

[SSM]) to comply with the State Implementation Plan (SIP) Call as published in the *Federal Register* by EPA on June 12, 2015 (80 FR 33840) and to conform with EPA's restated and updated SSM policy applicable to SIPs.

7. Rulemaking – OAC 252:205 Hazardous Waste Management

The DEQ is proposing to make revisions to Chapter 205 as follows: (1) to incorporate by reference the federal hazardous waste regulations found in 40 CFR Parts 124 and 260-279 revised as of July 1, 2015, including the revocation of the Comparable Fuels Rule and the Gasification Rule pursuant to a federal court order dated June 27, 2014, and including those revisions to 40 CFR published at 80 FR 1694-1814 (January 13, 2015) pertaining to the "Definition of Solid Waste: Final Rule"; and (2) to update and improve the rules for Transfer Station Development and Operations Plans, which were originally promulgated in the early 1990s.

The statutorily prescribed purpose of this report is to outline the DEQ's annual funding needs for providing environmental services within its jurisdiction, reflect any new federal mandates, and summarize DEQ-recommended statutory changes. The Environmental Quality Board is to review, amend (as necessary) and approve the report.
