## **DEQ Asks for Public's Help in Finding Stolen Gauge**

The Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is asking for the public's help in locating a gauge containing radioactive material that was stolen from the area of E. Reno Ave. and S. Eastern Ave. in Oklahoma City.

The Troxler Model 3430 gauge is used to measure the density and moisture content of soil. The gauge represents a low threat of exposure as long as the gauge is not unlocked. If unlocked, the source can pose a risk to human health.
